Scheduled Monthly Support - The best and easiest way to give: Like most non-profits, Damascus Home can only budget on support they receive on a regular basis. Whether it is \$10 monthly or \$1000 monthly, regular support tells us what support we can count on (and therefore budget from).

To set up monthly support: Damascus Ministry utilizes Network153.net to facilitate on-line giving. Network153 is a ministry support clearinghouse. Use this link https://network153.net/product/usa-damascus-home-of-redwater-usa013/ to go directly to our support window. Scroll to the bottom and choose your donation amount and your donation frequency (choose monthly) and select "Add to cart". Then click the "PayPal" button. NOTE: You do not need a PayPal account to set up your transaction. All you need is a credit or debit card. Ignore the Login information and scroll down to the "Pay with Credit Card" button. You will then be directed to a secure site where you provide your card information just like you would any online transaction. It will draft from your account on or about the 4th of every month.

Quarterly Support – Newsletter: Every newsletter you receive contains an envelope stamped with our return address. Send it back with a check enclosed. Newsletters are distributed quarterly. If you return a check at each distribution, you are a quarterly supporter!

A Journey down "The Street!"

Jesus taught this simple but complex statement, "... Deny self...!" With this command in mind, you may have found yourself in a situation where you almost felt like giving up. You attempted everything in your ability to improve the situation, but no matter how hard you tried, it only seemed to get worse. You felt like you were at "the end of your rope." Below are some encouraging words I was taught from a prominent Christian Counselor, Bob George.

But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us. 2 Cor. 4:7 (NKJ)

I've heard people tell me many times during counseling, "I'm almost at the end of my rope!" My response is, "Put some grease on that thing so you can get to the end of it!"

Often, we find ourselves in troublesome relationships with other people. It may be a boss who's not a Christian, an overbearing in-law, or a child who's a bit too active. Whatever the circumstance, our patience runs thin and we begin to get angry and bitter. We usually respond with, "Lord, just give me the strength to endure this!" What we need to understand is that God doesn't want to help us with our patience or ability. He sent His Son so we could die to ourselves and trust His ability.

You can hold on to your own intellectual understanding or willpower. Sooner or later, given the right circumstances, these things are going to give out. You can either "let go of your rope" and trust Christ to work in and through you in the midst of the situation or continue to hold on to your own resources, therefore, truly never experiencing true joy and freedom found in Jesus.

Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 12:10: "I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." In the midst of our day-to-day hardships and struggles, we can experience the peace and the strength that can come only from Christ.

Are you still hanging on to your rope? Are you still clinging to your own understanding and ability? If so, let go and allow the Lord to take control of your circumstances. That's why He sent His Son, who was without sin, to die in our place. Christ took the penalty for our sin, was raised from the dead, and sent the Holy Spirit to live His life through us. He's the only one who can live the Christian life.

The Lord longs for us is to trust Him, surrender and let go and let Him guide and direct us. At **Straight Street**, many a man has found the serenity to humble themselves and find this security and trust in Jesus.

Graduate Testimony-Daisa Lehrman McWilliams

My life verse is Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

It has been a long, long road. I have shut my family out for years. I have burned through relationships. My addiction started when I was eight years old. I started doing hard drugs when I was 14 and I pushed everybody that loved me away. Every time someone gave me a chance or wanted to, I blew the opportunity. In November of 2013 my 1yr old son was taken from me by his father and he and my son disappeared. On November 24th. I attempted suicide, but the Lord saved me from that. I was angry, I was sad, I was broken, I didn't think there was any way out. I had given up on the Lord and I thought He had given up on me. I was surprised when I woke up in a hospital bed. I said to myself, "Well I am still here. Now what?" They offered me help at the hospital and that is how I came to the Damascus Women's Center. One night at the church alter I asked the Lord to please show me why I was still here. I had strayed away from my family; I didn't know my purpose and I didn't understand why I didn't die.

The next day a volunteer (Mrs. Jill), approached me and she said, "Daisa, I have something to tell you. I have known this for a couple of weeks, but I didn't feel like the time was right until now, to tell you." Mrs. Jill knew nothing about my past. She didn't know anything about my suicide attempt or anything I was thinking. She said, "I know who saved your life." I had prayed about "that day." I didn't know what transpired the day I survived my suicide attempt. It was a constant prayer before God. Now she was standing there referring to "that day."

I thought I had planned it out perfectly. I had posted on Facebook, "You know I wish things could have turned out differently." I didn't think that comment was going to send up any red flags to anybody. I was supposed to be at work. Everyone at home thought I was at work and everyone at work thought I was at home. I was working a split shift that day and I thought it was the perfect plan. But someone *did* notice. Emily is a girl I went to high school with and she saw that post. I hadn't seen Emily for a few years. I sincerely believe the Lord let her know something was wrong with me. He *urged* Emily to help me.

She started calling. Emily didn't give up. She called my work. She called mutual friends that we had. She called anybody and everybody she could think of. Everyone Emily spoke to responded something like, 'She will be OK or 'She will be fine.' Emily wasn't convinced. She was very persistent and wouldn't give up until someone actually went to my apartment. Because she didn't live in my town, she finally convinced the police to make a concerned welfare call at my apartment.

I had locked all my doors and windows. I didn't want anybody to find me. I was done. I was miserable. I was done with life. Because of Emily, they found me. When they reached me I was dying. They had to resuscitate me, and I was taken by ambulance to the hospital.

So, while I was a resident of Damascus Women's Center, I was baptized. The volunteer Mrs. Jill took a picture of my baptism and put my first name under the photo. She was sharing at work, showing what God had done in "this resident Daisa." Another co-worker recognized the name. She said, "I know that name!" The co-worker asked if she could borrow the picture for a moment because she wanted to show it to another co-worker. That co-worker happened to be my "Emily." The last thing Emily heard about me was that I was on my way to the hospital and they didn't know if I would be okay.

Over two months later, she is handed a photo of me being baptized. When I later spoke to Emily, she said, I broke down and praised God right there in the office." Emily has burdens of her own she is facing and struggling with. I ask that everybody pray for her. I feel like the Lord has laid it upon me to help Emily. I asked for a purpose and I have received a purpose. I firmly believe that I am going to help other people in their struggles, in their loss and in their darkness, as God allows. I'm going to get there, and I am so excited. I have never been this happy in my life, ever.

Update: An exit plan was set up with Daisa's father and stepmother upon leaving the Damascus Women's Center. She would live with them and start a new life. Within a few weeks, Daisa was able to take possession of her baby boy. She and her son lived in a safe environment in her parent's home and church. Also, shortly after Daisa completed her rehabilitation at the Damascus Women's Center she was able to reach out to Emily and help her. They are both beautiful examples of the love of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. All glory and honor go to the precious Lamb of God. Daisa is now married, over six years clean and sober, and she and her husband have a second child, a little girl, and they have just purchased their first home. They continue to serve and love the Lord and to help others. Daisa Lehrman McWilliams continues to remark how wonderful her life is and gives God the glory.
